BACKGROUND

Voluntary Institute for Rural Development (VIRD) is an Odisha based non-profit organization, working in two tribal districts of Odisha. Under the current situation COVID-19 has extremely affected the, the rural poor tribal families, comprising of vulnerable Scheduled Tribe, Scheduled Cates families, wage labourers, migrants and unorganized sectors workers including People with Disabilities and single women headed households have been the worst hit. These groups have lost the only source of their income and have no means to make ends meet or provide food for their families. Under this critical circumstance, JDF has stepped in to support such groups in the time of this emergency by providing them with essential grocery support through Voluntary Institute for Rural Development. Very needy households were identified in our operational tribal concentrated Angul & Dehogarh district of Odisha for grocery distribution. This humanitarian aid has been an effective way to contribute during the ongoing COVID-19 crisis.
